Board Report - Oct. 2024

- Approved September disbursements totaling \$348,453. 10 new member applications, and September 2024 construction in the amount of \$96,609.
- Reviewed financial results for September with \$473,071 Operating Margins and \$574,652 Total Margins year to date.
- There were 7 outages in September, with an average YTD outage time per meter of 1.1402 hours.
- Nine applications for discounted early retirement of capital credits to estates were approved with total capital credits of \$16,491 to be paid out at the net present value of \$8,777.
- 32 delinquent accounts were processed for collection following the October 20th due date. The total amount owing on these accounts is \$12,254.
- Other topics covered included economic development training from DPC, South Carolina outage response, local outages, preliminary capital budget, follow up on Cooperative Day of Service at Sackett's Lake and the fall member appreciation event, donations, and activities at DPC.
