

Board Report - Oct. 2025

- Approved September disbursements totaling \$336,312. 19 new member applications, and September 2025 construction in the amount of \$107,081.
- Reviewed financial results for September with \$510,691
 Operating Margins and \$602,920 Total Margins year to date.
- There were 4 outages in September, with an average YTD outage time per meter of 0.2076 hours.
- Four applications for discounted early retirement of capital credits to estates were approved with total capital credits of \$8,495 to be paid out at the net present value of \$4,805.
- 53 delinquent accounts were processed for collection following the October 20th due date. The total amount owing on these accounts is \$27,113.
- Other topics covered included using the upcoming meetings, bylaw review, Key Ratio presentation from Cooperative Finance Corporation.
