Board Report – June 2020

- Approved May disbursements totaling \$627,565.88, 18 new member applications, and May 2020 construction in the amount of \$90,740.18.
- Reviewed financial results for the month of May, with \$78,878 operating margins and \$98,329 total margins year- to-date.
- There were 9 outages in May, with average YTD outage time per meter of .1498 hours.
- Two application for discounted early retirement of capital credits to estates were approved with total capital credits of \$3969.98 to

be paid out at the net present val- • ue of \$2,445.80.

- 23 delinquent accounts were processed for collection following the June 20th due date. The total amount owing on these accounts is \$7,165.34. Eighteen of these accounts have remote disconnect capability.
 - One policy was reviewed, 2.39 Safety First Grant and Loan Program.
- Dairyland Power selected a new CEO, Brent Ridge, provided a 10year forecast, and retired capital credits back to Taylor Electric.

CEO Ceaglske gave an update on the COVID 19 response, plans for the annual meeting, cable plow replacement research, cable locating services, and member news and issues.

Home cooling makes up a large portion of your energy bills. Try to keep the difference between the temperature of your thermostat setting and the outside temperature to a minimum. The smaller the difference, the more energy you will save.

Fuel Tank and LP Tank Clearance Information

Keep fuel tanks safe distances from meter poles and meter pedestals

Taylor Electric Cooperative's efforts to deliver safe and reliable energy means we must be aware of potential electrical hazards. Anyone who has a fuel tank or any flammable liquid dispenser on his or her property should know that it's important to keep the unit and dispensing nozzle away from meters and power lines.

The picture shown is our interpretation of both the National Electric Safety Code (NESC) and the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA30) recommendations.

IMPORTANT SAFETY RECOMMENDATIONS

- Minimum distance of any fuel tank from a meter, electric distribution panel, transformer or electric switching equipment is **20 feet**.
- Please be sure that the hose and nozzle do not reach within 10 feet of any electrical equipment.

Maintaining safe distances will help to prevent fuel vapors from collecting in the conduit or electrical boxes. If fuses were to blow or an electrical arc were to occur, a lethal explosion could result.
