## **Board Report - April 2021**

- Approved March disbursements totaling \$579,374.
   17 new member applications, and February 2021 construction in the amount of \$229,397.
- Reviewed financial results for March, with \$156,889 Operating Margins and \$165,518 Total Margins year to date.
- There were 6 outages in March, with average YTD outage time per meter of .08 hours.
- Five applications for discounted early retirement of capital credits to estates were approved with total capital credits of \$4,098 to be paid out at the net present value of \$2,109.
- 13 delinquent accounts were processed for collection following the March 20th due date. The total amount owing on these accounts is \$3,981.
- The DPC power cost credit will be passed along in

- the bills.
- The Meeting Expense policy was updated.
- The details for the Annual Meeting were discussed, it will be outdoors, drive in style, on June 29, registration and meal serving to start at 4:30, meeting at 5:30. There was an emergency resolution passed to adjust the election process to make it more efficient.
- There was discussion on upcoming training opportunities as well as upcoming DPC activities.
- CEO Ceaglske gave an update on the COVID 19 response, generator issues, Taylor County Broadband, and member issues.
- The meeting closed with a visit from the new CFC representative and a short presentation on the Key Ratio Trend Analysis for 2019.
